1 I will praise thee, O LORD, with my whole heart;
3 When my enemies are turned back,
5 Thou hast rebuked the heathen, thou hast destroyed the wicked,

1 I will shew forth all thy marvellous works.
3 they shall fall and perish at thy presence.
5 thou hast put out their name for ever and ever.

2 I will be glad and rejoice in thee:
4 For thou hast maintained my right and my cause;
6 O thou enemy, destructions are come to a perpetual end:

2 I will sing praise to thy name, O thou most High.
4 thou satest in the throne judging right.
6 and thou hast destroyed cities; their memorial is perished with them.

7 But the Lord shall endure for ever:
9 The Lord also will be a refuge for the oppressed,

7 He hath prepared his throne for judgment,
9 a refuge in times of trouble.

8 And he shall judge the world in righteousness,
10 And they that know thy name will put their trust in thee.

8 He shall minister judgment to the people in uprightness.
10 For thou, Lord, hast not forsaken them that seek thee.

11 Sing praises to the LORD, which dwelleth in Zion:
 13 Have mercy on me, O LORD; consider my trouble, which I suffer of them that hate me,
 15 The heathen are sunk down in the pit, that they made:

11 Declare a- mong the people his doings.
 13 thou that liftest me up from the gates of death:
 15 in the net which they hid is their own foot taken.

12 When he maketh inquisition for blood,
 14 That I may shew forth all thy praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion:
 16 The LORD is known by the judgment which he executeth:

12 he remembereth them: he forgetteth not the cry of the humble.
 14 I will rejoice in thy salvation,
 16 the wicked is snared in the work of his own hands.
